ParaGard: Increase in menstrual flow; Mirena: Blood clots and stroke	Cramping after insertion, infection, weight gain, bloating, breast tenderness, spotting	YES	ParaGard: Immediately, Mirena: Immediately if injected during first 7 days after start of period, otherwise backup needed for 1 week	Mirena: progestin (levonorgestrel), ParaGard: copper coil
