# **COLONEL TAYLOR T. FERRELL**

Col Taylor T. Ferrell is the commander of the 18th Operations Group, 18th Wing, Kadena Air Base, Japan. He commands nearly 900 people in nine squadrons and 80 F-15, KC-135, HH-60, and E-3 aircraft valued at more than \$4 billion. The 18th Operations Group performs all 18th Wing flying, as well as aeromedical and combat rescue missions, in support of U.S. and allied interests. As the commander of the 18th Expeditionary Operations Group, Col Ferrell commands more than 300 people in three squadrons and four aircraft which perform daily Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance missions.

Col Ferrell graduated from Centre College in 2000 and received his commission from the University of Kentucky ROTC program. He commanded the 57th Operations Support Squadron and served as the Deputy Commander of the 414th Combat Training Squadron. He is a graduate of F-15C Weapons School and served as the USAFWS F-15C Chief Instructor Pilot. He has flown homeland defense missions in support of Operation NOBLE EAGLE and is a graduate of the Air Command and Staff College, the School of Advanced Air and Space Studies, and the Dwight D. Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy at the National Defense University. Prior to his current position, he served as the United States Forces Korea J5 Strategy and Policy Division Chief, Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea.



Colonel Ferrell is a command pilot with 1,850 hours in the F-15C/D.
