The Department of the Air Force (DAF) Voting Assistance Program (VAP) is committed to providing first-class assistance so that service members, their families, and overseas citizens can successfully vote absentee anywhere in the world.

The Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) protects the right to vote for members of the Uniformed Services (including activated Reserve and Guard), Merchant Marines, their spouses and dependents, and United States (U.S.) citizens residing outside the territorial limits of the U.S.

The Kadena Military & Family Readiness Center serves as the Installation Voter Assistance (IVA) Office. The IVA Office provides information and assistance on the absentee voting process to include:

- Completing a Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The FPCA allows you to request voter registration in your state of legal voting residence, request absentee ballots, and update your voter contact information.
- Fill out a Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB). This form serves as a back-up if the requested ballot is not received in time.


